Festivaletteratura kicks off its twenty-sixth edition without ever having called a halt in the last two years. In the long period of restrictions and distancing, we tiptoed cautiously around the city trying many things out, becoming more familiar with virtual spaces and their opportunities. But we also experimented with things that were completely new to us and that continue to stimulate, even now that we hope to return to the shared spaces we had been forced to give up.

This year we are trying to occupy more space in the city at a time when the need for literature is constantly on the rise. Literature can read the world, interpret its fears and hopes, see distinctly what does not yet have a name – it can remember and look beyond. The Festival is back in town with authors coming to Mantova from all over the world, engaging literature in an open, urgent and enquiring dialogue with other arts, languages and fields of knowledge. This will not be a low-key event: many of the initiatives involve physical participation, where readers will be invited to act, think and engage in the newly reclaimed piazzas. After all, we know how dreams conceived in Mantova tend to expand. A warm welcome to all of you coming to the Festival!

How to get tickets for the 2022 edition of Festivaletteratura. We ask you to read the following information carefully.

HOW TO PURCHASE

Festivaletteratura tickets can only be purchased online at → www.festivaletteratura.it from 9:00 on Wednesday 31 August for filofestival members from 9:00 on Friday 2 September for everyone else

At the end of the purchasing procedure, the user will receive the **PDF tickets by email.** These must be shown either printed or on your phone at the event venues. Your automatically assigned seat number will be printed on the ticket. **It will not be possible to purchase tickets at event venues.**

Accepted payment methods: STRIPE (debit and credit cards), SATISPAY, AMAZON PAY.

To facilitate the purchasing process, from Wednesday 24 August it will be possible to pre-register on the ticketing platform at the bit.ly/fl-login.

REGULATIONS FOR FILOFESTIVAL MEMBERS

The deadline for signing up for the Filofestival membership card is 7 August.

Members of the Filofestival Association can purchase tickets from 9:00 on Wednesday 31 August.

When purchasing online you will need to enter the 6-character alphanumeric number (printed on the card or received by e-mail). **THE CARD IS STRICTLY PERSONAL**

Each individual member can book 1 ticket only per event for events that are compatible in terms of time (distance of at least two hours).

As of this year, the service will allow two members **to purchase adjacent seats**. To do so, all that is required is that one member purchases the two tickets at the reduced rate and enters the two membership card numbers during the purchasing process.

It will also be possible to purchase events for children using the ordinary membership card. The membership discount is approximately 10% of the full ticket price.

THE 'SPECIAL FORMATS' OF **FESTIVALETTERATURA 2022**

Festivaletteratura's programme has always been designed more for exceptions than rules, so it seems a little strange to call some of its events 'special'. Yet it is undeniable that, alongside conversations between authors, readings, workshops and performances, there are some groups of events that stand out for the way in which writers and audience come together, for the way stories and thoughts spread and enter into circulation. You can spot the events associated with these 'special formats' - some long-standing, others much more recent - in the programme and on the Festival sites thanks to their icon or by the subheading.

RADIO FESTIVALETTERATURA

In 2020 and 2021 Radio Festivaletteratura offered an almost uninterrupted stream of broadcasts during the days of the event, recreating the live Festival experience on the web. With a bolder return to in person events, the radio will be accentuating its nature as an 'editing' hub: five podcasts are planned for 2022, all of which will be broadcast in the following weeks. During the five days of the Festival we will see the podcasts launched live, where the hosts will present themes, ideas and contributions that will shape the episodes to air in the autumn and involve some of the guests present at the Festival.

Philanthrocapitalism is the focus of the debate between environmentalist Vandana Shiya (From Greed to Care, Oneness vs the 1%: Shattering Illusions, Seeding Freedom, Terra Viva) and economist and global health expert Nicoletta Dentico (Ricchi e buoni?). The 'caring agenda' of wealthy global entrepreneurs whether it covers health, agriculture or technology - hides an enormous concession of power by the states that are meant to regulate this same elite of

financial giants, who are then free to "condition public policy around the world through their philanthropy". Pharmaceutical patents, seed banks, bioengineering and gene editing are just some of the aspects of this subtle colonisation of the Earth. The two authors will discuss the possibility of "ushering in a new phase of global democracy, one that prevents the greed of the few from turning abundance into scarcity, law into privilege, and the interconnectedness of the living into oppression and domination".

"First, some people do research, make preliminary drafts and draw detailed plans, but I don't do any of this, because it is all already done, it exists in me, in my way of understanding the world and literature, indeed literature-world". On reading these words by Mircea Cărtărescu one can already guess why the Romanian author (Solenoid, the Blinding trilogy) is considered a figure who transcends writing alone, to penetrate, like roots spreading through the soil, metaphysics, natural sciences and symbolism, a visionary at ease with magic realism, influenced by the fantastic-mythological tradition of his own country. Reading Cărtărescu is a psychedelic journey into a dreamlike and decadent Bucharest; exploring his 'non-method' of artistry an enlightening experience for its complete contrast to the modus operandi of his colleagues. The author of Melancolia (coming out soon in Italian) will be talking to Federica Manzon (Il bosco del confine).

The main characters of *The Promise*, which won Damon Galgut the prestigious Man Booker Prize in 2021, live and struggle in a country unlike any imagined by Steve Biko and Nelson Mandela. Following on from The Good Doctor and other lucidly introspective prose, he chronicles the upheavals that shake a Calvinist Afrikaner family and its former servants. The great South African novelist portravs the expectations, bewilderment and betravals of a nation redeemed from

the systemic violence of apartheid although still unable to make peace with the present, Galgut offers readers "a spectacular demonstration of how the novel can radically change the way we see and think afresh". He talks to author Valeria Parrella (Almarina, Quel tipo di donna, La fortuna).

The author will speak in English, with consecutive interpretation into Italian.



In such dramatic times, when Russia seems inaccessible from the outside, the only way to approach this immense nation is to travel the borders of the numerous states that surround it. many of which gained independence from Moscow on Christmas Day 1991, after the collapse of the former Soviet Union. Tundra, steppes and huge mountain ranges form the backdrop for the adventurous geopolitical reportages of writer and anthropologist Erika Fatland (The Border. Sovietistan, Hiah: A Journey Across the Himalayas Through Pakistan, India, Bhutan, Nepal and Ching) who, travelling the old Silk Road and on from Ashgabat -the 'Las Vegas of the desert'to Pyongyang, has analysed the cultures and societies, steeped in history and contradictions. of Central Asia where the influence of the Kremlin is often slow to fade and former elites are pitted against younger generations in search of change. The Norwegian author will lead us along the borders of these regions of ancient charm together with Eleonora Sacco (Piccolo alfabeto per viaggiatori selvatici) and Angelo Zinna (Un altro bicchiere di arak), tireless travellers in the former Soviet territory and authors of the podcast Cemento.



60 I EDIT A BOOK LIKE YOU EDIT A FILM

The fast, dark and broken lines richly traced by illustrator and writer Frédéric Paiak recall the complex and sometimes expressionist light effects of etching. Nothing, in fact, in the work of the author of Uncertain Manifesto (winner of the Goncourt Prize for biography in 2019. whose third instalment of the multi-volume series has recently come out in Italian) leaves one indifferent: according to Le Nouvel Observateur, Pajak has brought the art of the graphic essay to perfection. In a veritable literary feat, the illustrator mixes memoir, biography, novel and fiction in images, his turbulent life running parallel to the experiences of some of the 20th century's great intellectuals, such as Walter Benjamin or André Breton. The result is a journey that spans eras and places - stretching a thread between France and Italy - and, by combining drawing and words, he explores the losers in the eyes of society, 'obeying only one master'. the book. The writer and illustrator will be talking to Giorgio Fontana (Il mago di Riga).

Where the distance between the rural heartlands and the skyscrapers of San Francisco or New York is not measured simply in miles, otten social may ties find expression only in the haunting lyrics of country music. From the Midwest state of Kansas is journalist Sarah Smarsh (She Come by it Natural. Dolly Perton and the Women who lived her Songs, Heartland), whose essays and member the same communities. oirs analyse the lives shared by countless working-class rural communities

and the women who belong to them through the lens of historical, political and economic data. The picture of an America abandoned by the institutions, where the very poor live light years away from the middle class, reflects a nation where the famous 'dream' often turns into a nightmare for those who "have access to nothing in the country where there is everything". The author will be talking to US expert and deputy editor of II Post Francesco Costa (Una storia americana) about this eye-opening 'ballad' of the white and Catholic working class of America.

63 NIGERIA BETWEEN DREAM AND REALITY

Ben Okri with **Peter Florence**

If you have never heard of the 'stoku', now is the time to read Ben Okri's most recent book published in Italian (Prayer for the Living). Inventor of this genre that fuses short story and haiku and winner of the 1991 Booker Prize (The Famished Road), the Afro-European writer skilfully combines metaphysical and mythological elements with real-life experiences in his home country, be it the tragic Nigerian civil war or the damage wrought by the greedy oil industry on places of natural beauty. Always devoting body and soul to writing without allowing himself the distractions of social media or marketing, he declares: "I would rather write a masterpiece and have a handful of readers in my time, and millions more in the future, than have millions of readers now and no one in the future. Literature is an endurance activity. Nothing has changed in that regard except marketing and publicity. But all the marketing and publicity cannot make a book better than it really is. Time is limited, and it passes faster than we realize. I would rather invest what time I have left on the perfection of the work". The author will be conversing with Peter Florence.

William T. Vollmann with Claudia Durastanti

The prose of American William Tanner Vollmann shuns labels or genre boundaries. Paradoxical, provocative - and always one step ahead of provocation itself -, Vollmann plumbs the turbulent depths of our age and a past where others dare not venture, delivering a profusion of pages that come very close to a world-opus. The voices of the journalist, the historian, the outcast and the novelist are often hard to distinguish in his vast production: in the desperate tales of prostitution at the heart of Butterfly Stories, or the dramatic authoritarian saga Europe Central, which in 2005 earned him the National Book Award; and not forgetting the ambitious Seven Dreams Series, on the settlement of North America and the conflict between natives and pioneers. Claudia Durastanti (Strangers I know), a long-standing fan, hops aboard the train to meet one of contemporary fiction's most elusive authors.

Metamorphosis as a way of seeking solutions and future perspectives for a more habitable world is the theme linking the many activities planned for Scienceground. These will include collective readings of a bibliography of transformation; workshops on measuring the environment, food metamorphosis and climate anthropology; installations on microplastics and much more.

Barbados, Nigeria and South Africa: in the heart of writer and architect Yewande Omotoso, the three countries where she grew up coexist in equal measure, giving her that 'migrant form' that has largely influenced her work. The author of *An Unusual Grief* and *The Woman Next Door* takes Cape Town as the point of departure and return for her novels, analysing in depth human relationships of friendship, love and motherhood, in which the wounds to heal recall those of a country long plagued by apartheid. And she does so by combining drama and humour with the experience of someone who has lived steeped in storytelling: "I remember the evenings when my father would gather us all together and start telling stories in English but also in Yoruba. I don't know if in listening to those stories I perceived a desire to become a writer. I do remember though that I loved those moments and it seems as if writing was already a possibility in my life". Yewande Omotoso will be talking to writer and journalist Nadeesha Uyangoda.

82 ANIMALS AS MENTORS

Looking back in a 2017 interview, British naturalist and ornithologist Helen Macdonald explained: "As a child, I was in close contact with nature. I would spend my days outdoors, observing wild animals. I used to catch lizards and snakes and butterflies to observe them up close. I was rather introverted, and I didn't understand social conventions, so animals were like an extended family because they were always there: reliable, interesting and beautiful". One of

the leading nature writers of recent years, she has described in essays, articles and auto-fiction the relationship between humans and other living beings, ranging from the ancient art of falconry (in her highly successful *H is for Hawk*) to broader reflections on the dualism between captivity and freedom (as in the more recent *Vesper Flights*). Too often we take the presence of the animal world for granted. The Surrey-based author will instead remind us how necessary it is to rediscover the wonder of observing it and thus learn different nuances of our own nature. She will be talking to writer Michela Murgia.

Ireland: an island of voices

The prolific and celebrated literary career of John Banville (Snow, April in Spain, Even the Dead, Vengeance) runs along two tracks. While on holiday in Sardinia in 2001, the Irish author and winner of the 2005 Man Booker Prize with The Sea decided to branch off into the detective genre, hardly imagining that the initial experiment would lead to the birth of his enigmatically named alter ego Benjamin Black, a master of crime fiction and a lover of the classic detective stories of Georges Simenon and Raymond Chandler. If with the 'high' novels Banville delights in using words that "leave the reader reaching for a dictionary" - so obsessive and perfectly constructed is his quest for lexical precision - his crime novels give him the chance for a more leisurely pace with Inspector Strafford and the pathologist Quirke, in the knowledge that, as Kafka quipped "The artist is the one who has nothing to say. That is, one can only show, display, present the evidence". We will be following the trail of clues together with Peter Florence.



The woods have been a scary place for at least seven hundred years. We have always felt lost or at the mercy of wild beasts; and perhaps this is partly why we have proceeded with increasing speed to deforest the entire planet, to the point of endangering our own future and that of other living species. To reverse the trend, the woodland needs to reclaim wasteland and make room for itself in cities; but above all, we need to learn to live with the woods and experience them on a daily basis. In April this year, Festivaletteratura planted around 1,300 trees on an alluvial plain not far from Mantova, creating a small forest just a few metres from the river Po. In this 26th edition, it is launching roaming the woods, a series of scientific-liter-

ary-fun exploratory trails to prepare us for forest

life. Guiding these daytime and evening excursions will be writers and botanists, zoologists and artists, ornithologists and walkers, actors and musicians, who will help us to direct our gaze, regulate our breathing, expand our minds, and show us each time a different way of being in the midst of nature. Roaming the woods includes eight events in nature reserves, public parks, private gardens and 'street greenery', designed to raise a new environmental awareness and to practice (and defend) biodiversity in everyday life.





Two opposing attitudes prevail in our civilisation: on one hand, animals are reduced to things, means or goods and on the other, they are completely anthropomorphised, with human characteristics being projected onto them in a Disney-like process. Between these two extremes lies the research of those who today question the animal mind, in a discipline midway between philosophy and ethology. In dialogue with the experts, L'Altro Animale will be discussing the virtues and limitations of anthropomorphism, the origin of the mind, the different forms of consciousness, and how these reflections can condition our relationship with animals such as octopuses, pigs, hawks, and gorillas, in which we find a familiar other that is sometimes consoling, sometimes disturbing but that however astonishes and engages us. Helen Macdonald, naturalist and author of Vesper Flights, introduces us to the topic of the podcast together with its editor Paolo Pecere.

Great excitement this year in the piazza where the Festival began. The debut of the live events of RADIO FESTIVALETTERATURA will be taking place in a tent pitched beneath the windows of the former Benedictine convent, the headquarters of the press office and the web and social media editors of Festivaletteratura.

In particular:

at Area 6 in Piazza Alberti - for the entire duration of the Festival - people will be able to bring ideas, observations and amendments by writing their proposals on the wall dedicated to the law.

at the important assembly meeting on Friday 9 at 11:00 at the Diocesan Museum, with the extraordinary participation of John Freeman and Daniele Aristarco in their role as consultants.

After the Festival, the text of the legislation will be officially drafted with a view to its presentation to the appropriate legal bodies.

In the heart of the City, between 1599 and 1600, what today we would call a start-up was born which soon became the most influential commercial enterprise of its time: the British East India Company. Greatly anticipating the emergence of global markets, in which wealthy multinationals affect political and economic arrangements of state, this powerful association of merchants branched out to almost every continent, eventually finding itself involved in the creation of Hong Kong and Singapore and the outbreak of the American War of Independence. The British historian and Asian expert William Dalrymple (*Return of a King, From the Holy Mountain*) has dug meticulously through historical sources – British and especially Indian – to recount with extreme precision the unregulated parable of the Company, from the conquest of Bengal until its dissolution in 1874. 




GETTING ABOUT

Getting to Mantova and about town (in the most eco-friendly way possible)

Since 2021 we've done our best to reduce the festival's ecological footprint. Here is some essential information to help you organise your trip with carbon emissions and the environment in mind.

TRAINS Rail connections to Mantova from: MILAN, VERONA, MODENA, BOLOGNA, CREM-ONA. The station is just a few minutes' walk from the old town.

BUSES Several lines connect the old town with other places in the province, outside the province and with the different neighbourhoods of the city. The LINEA CC is a circular bus route that takes you right round the old town, with departures every 15 minutes. Full details of all APAM city and intercity bus services are available online (www.apam.it).

E-VAI ELECTRIC CAR SHARING E-Vai offers an electric car sharing service with charging stations in 80 municipalities in Lombardy and at Malpensa, Linate and Orio al Serio airports. To use it, simply register, book your car on the E-Vai app or the website and pick it up from one of the charging stations and you're off. All information on e-vai.com.

PARK AND RIDE There are 4 park-and-ride car parks located at various entry points to the city: Campo Canoa, Piazzale Montelungo and Cimitero degli Angeli (free of charge) and the Porta Pradella underground car park (pay and display). Apam operates a free shuttle service into town departing every 12 minutes from 7:00 to 24:00 on Festival days, from Campo Canoa and Piazzale Montelungo. RideMovi bikes (see section on cycling) will be available at all 4 car parks.

Other car parks in town: Anconetta, Porta Mulina, Piazza D'Arco, Piazza San Giovanni, Piazza Virgiliana, Piazzale Gramsci, viale Risorgimento, viale Isonzo, viale Mincio (pay and display).

→VISITORS WITH LIMITED MOBILITY

ANFFAS offers a dedicated service with purpose-trained staff and in full compliance with anti-covid measures. Departures from Campo Canoa and Piazza Virgiliana car parks. There is no charge

for this service, but reservations must be made by Tuesday 6 September, For information and booking: 0376.360515 - 338.6617278 (Graziella) from Monday to Friday 9.00-13.00 and 16.00-19.00.

CYCLING Mantova is a mostly flat, bikefriendly town with a historic centre largely closed to traffic and good cycling infrastructure. Cycling is undoubtedly the most convenient and fastest way of getting around the city. To encourage its use even over longer distances (in urban routes between 5 and 10 km, the bicycle is faster than the car in terms of overall travel time and parking), we've created a map with safe cycle routes to the centre both from the neighbouring municipalities (Curtatone, Borgo Virgilio, San Giorgio Bigarello and Porto Mantovano) and from the four park-and-ride car parks, where those arriving by car can rent a bike - with assisted or non-assisted pedalling from the RideMovi free-flow bike-sharing service app (for rates see the RideMovi app). The recommended routes follow cycle paths and pedestrian areas or low-traffic roads.

During the Festival, from 7 to 11 September, RideMovi is offering the first 10 minutes of e-bike use for free with the code FESTIVAL22

The Festivaletteratura Archive was created in 2010, so that the material collected over the years by the Comi-Festivaletteratura tato Organizzatore di Festivaletteratura (now Associazione Mantova Festival Internazionali) and by Associazi-

one Filofestival (Friends of Festivaletteratura) could be made more widely available. The Lombardy Region's Superintending Body for Archives has recognised the major cultural value of this vast collection. As reorganisation and cataloguing continue, the Archive remains open by appointment: visitors might simply want to re-experience a vividly remembered event, or to use the wealth of available material as the basis for new projects.

In 2019 we celebrated our first ten years of activity with a new portal, born as a joint venture between the Festivaletteratura Archive and Promemoria Group, Promemoria made this possible thanks to a bespoke update of its Archiui.com platform, with innovative graphics and enhanced functional features. Its faster, more intuitive search function lets you start exploring as soon as you're on the home page, where you can look up past editions, guests, venues and all events from 1997 to date. We also added a special area for our press reviews and featured topics, as well as a news and information section.

The sound section of the Archive now contains over 2,000 audio recordings, spanning the various editions of the Festival, and a vast array of topics can be accessed online and enjoyed one by one. And you can expect a treasure trove of further surprises as the cataloguing continues - videos, photos, graphic art and related material, all providing a vivid record of an adventure that's still in full swing after over twenty-five years.

It began as a grassroots initiative during the run-up to the very first Festival in 1997, to help make a dream come true: the aim was to **bring authors** and their readers together **in a truly festive and wonderfully different setting**, where everyone could enjoy getting to know each other. Friends of Festivaletteratura currently has **nearly 3,000 members**, not only nationwide but internationally.

Annual enrolments open at the start of the calendar year and, as a new or returning member,
